"Have a purpose", "Just do it" and "It's all relative" are quotes that Dalton often heard as a boy growing up in the Risner household. These words have clearly impacted Dalton in becoming the young man that he is today and helped achieve his childhood dream of playing in the NFL.

From the town of Wiggins in northeast Colorado (population under 900), Dalton didn't let his small-town prospect limit his big-time ability. Highly recruited out of high school as ESPN's #7 center in the country, Dalton excelled at Kansas State University earning more accolades than anyone had ever imagined. As a sophomore, Dalton's peers voted him team captain in what would be his first of three years earning such a prestigious honor.

uring his final year at Kansas State, Dalton's real purpose in life became clear; he would use his football platform to create a foundation with a mission centered around "positively impacting others through love and kindness". Managing his priorities in order of God, Family and being kind to others is not just something he says, it's something he lives by.
